Meeting with the Allamakee County Emergency Staff

On November 17th, 2020, I met with Corey Snitker who is part of the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) for Allamakee County to discuss current information on the CCR Impoundment since his last site visit on December 3rd, 2019.

Mr. Snitker and I discussed the future of the Lansing Generating Station and he heard the news of the plant closing at some point in 2020. He was curious if the plant would still be on the property after 2022 and I let him know there are numerous items that would need to be completed before the demolition of the facility including pond closure by 10/17/2023.

We discussed that inspections are still performed on the impoundment, reminded him of the Alliant Energy's CCR Website, and let him know that our emergency action plan is still current. We talked about the seven-day inspection requirements and noted that we generally inspect the pond twice per week. We talked about the required professional engineer (PE) pond inspection and let him know the results showed no deficiencies.

This meeting started at 1:00 p.m. and I discussed historical conversations on the improvements to the impoundment which include closing the lower pond to increase the structural integrity of the Northern berm of the ash pond. We also again discussed the installation of the bentonite wall which continues to alleviate previous issues with seepage through the embankment.

We talked about the future of the pond and the impacts that our wastewater permit have on outfalling to unnamed stream #1. We also discussed the tighter metals limits required in the wastewater permit and we have chosen to re-routed outfall 002 to the Mississippi River which will allow for higher metals limits keeping the plant in service until 2022.
